What is Law School Exchange?

Law School Exchange (LSE) is a new “faculty-only” networking and content sharing site that makes it easy to deliver digital content to students

– Sort of like a cross between a large complimentary copy system, a self-publishing tool and LinkedIn®

Adding Materials to Law School Exchange

Author/Editor:

Why Aren't the Subjects and Material lists more refined?

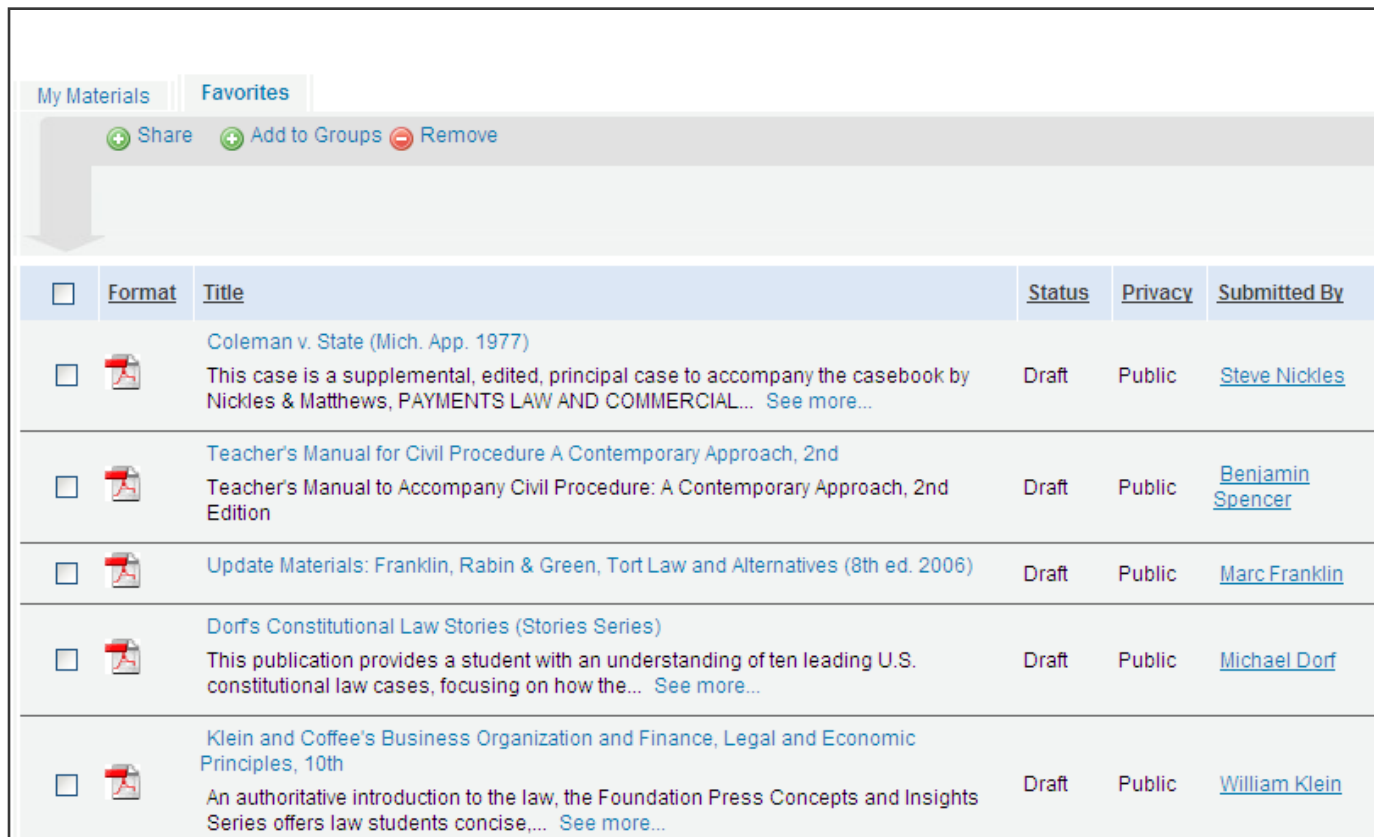
Subjects and material types are broad categories meant to establish a general categorization of materials on this site. Use tags if your material needs more descriptors than what is available in the broad categories.

A tag is a keyword that you assign to a material. This type of metadata helps to further refine a material description and allows users to find the material while searching or

Enhanced document viewing experience

- The Docviewer allows each user to maintain their own highlights and notes right on the document

- When material is uploaded the Docviewer retains the exact look and feel the creator intended. It does not reformat the document to “fit the screen”

- Benefits of the new Doc Viewer include: True to print display, print-like features (ability to add highlights and annotation to the material), ability to cut and paste from materials to other PC/Apple programs, adjustable viewing size, printing – print outs retain original format of the document, full-text searching, navigation – type in page number to go directly to desired page and the ability to mark citations with links to Westlaw.com (coming soon).

Additional functionality

- **Courses** – Use Law School Exchange to push content to your students. Similar to TWEN in its ability to distribute content.
- **Collections** - Law School Exchange users can create collections. For example, a professor may choose to create an electronic course packet which may include personal materials, West & Foundation Press materials and public materials added by colleagues from other law schools

Additional functionality

- **Blogs** - Blogs can provide commentary or news on a particular subject. The blogs will combine text, images, and links as well as allow comments by readers of the blog.
- **Wikis** - Easy way to share, edit and contribute information on a web page making communication and collaboration with colleagues on Law School Exchange simple.

Additional functionality

- **Browse** – The ability to browse for materials available on LSE by subject, school, tag and publisher.
- **Tag Search** - This kind of metadata helps describe the material and allows it to be found again by browsing or searching. Tags are chosen informally and personally by the material's submitter.
