It also includes analysis of the spirit and intent of the courts in construing the law, and the legislature's intent in enacting and amending the law. United States Code Annotated® (USCA®): *USCA* combines the official text of the U.S. Code with relevant cases, historical notes, indexes, cross-references and other annotations to provide a solid framework for researching federal law.

All federal and state cases including Supreme Court cases: Easily accessible through the National Reporter System®, an exclusive system of reporting federal and state cases that's editorially enhanced for complete research.

Code of Federal Regulations (CFR): The full body of federal administrative regulations. Features over 38,250 references to *USCA*, with hypertext links to the corresponding statute. Automatically incorporates weekly updates from the Government Printing Office.

Federal Register: 50,000 pages of current regulatory, administrative and executive materials generated by key

federal entities. Also includes proposed or promulgated amendments to any *CFR* section mentioned in the Federal Register database. Updated daily.

European Union Law: Search laws and regulations by topic, by date, and via full text.

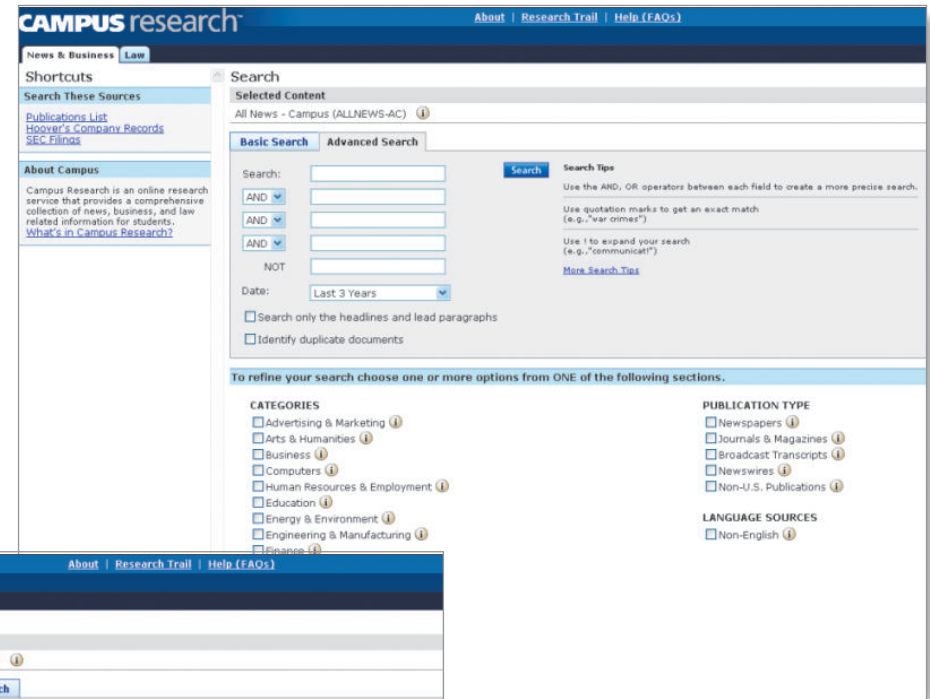

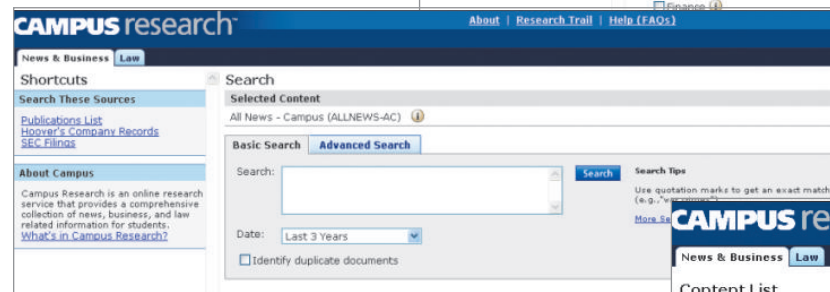
The easy-to-use interface is divided into two content tabs, News & Business and Law. Features include:

- Shortcuts in both tabs to find frequently used sources quickly, such as the A-Z publications list

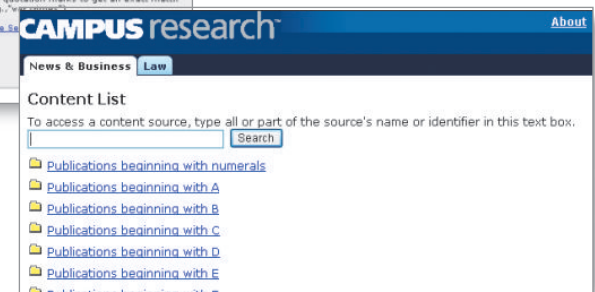
